The Nashoba Valley Amateur Radio Club cordially invites you to join us at the Heald Street Orchard in Pepperell, MA anytime from Saturday, June 25<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM to Sunday, June 26<sup>th</sup> at 2 PM for an annual demonstration of Amateur Radio Emergency Radio communication capability called Field Day. As one of the communities served by our membership we would like to extend this opportunity to you to meet and greet the local Amateur (Ham) Radio operators that provide communication capability for public service and emergency situations.

This event showcases the ability of Amateur Radio operators to setup and operate using only emergency power. This 24 hour operating event starts early Saturday morning with Hams setting up their equipment, antennas, and generators in various shelters in the middle of the orchard and will end late Sunday afternoon after operating around the clock to make contact with other Ham operators in the US.

In the past year alone, amateur radio people have made headlines with their work in the wildfires, floods, storms, tornadoes and other crises. With "Hams" provide emergency communications for many government and civic organizations in disasters. In addition, they provide supplemental communications when normal systems are rendered inoperable or overloaded.
