Last month's meeting was had two Show and Tells in addition to Craigs Field Day presentation. Earl WR1Y showed an early two tube Crosby receiver. He demonstrated how it tuned stations. The second quick talk was by Stan KD1LE who showed off the first two NVARC FoxFinder kits that were being shipped. They were handed over to Ralph KD1SM who represented the 'shipping' department. The first two units were delivered the weekend of June 19 and we are awaiting a critique by the buyers before we proceed.

Don't forget the NVARC FoxBox will be out constantly for the Summer. We usually feed it (change the batteries) and move it during the week. Though its not a definite schedule, we have been putting it at a new location where only the possible towns are given. Then the following weekend we have been moving it on the same site for those who are more inclined to a walking hunt.

The DTMF is functional so when you think you are close enough to want more frequent transmissions you transmit an asterisk immediately at the end of a fox transmission. You have to be quick since it only listens for 5 seconds at the end of each transmission (after the carrier drops). The fox will then transmit the next ten transmission at two minute and thirty second intervals.


