The Coronavirus has put a damper on things this year, and it has complicated NVARC elections, which are required to be held in April of each year.

In our recent NVARC business meeting, the Board came up with a plan to assure that elections go smoothly and fairly.

The first focus of the plan is that of Nominations.

Directors Bruce, K1BG, Jim, AB1WQ, and Ed, N1YFK, have been appointed by the Board as the

Nominating Committee.

The Nominating Committee is accepting nominations at **nvarc_board@n1nc.org** for all four Officer (President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer) positions, and for one Director position.

Of the incumbents, so far, Stan, KD1LE, has indicated he will not run for any position.

Nominations will be open until April 12, 2020.

After the nominations are complete, the Secretary will produce an email ballot that will be sent to each member on **April 14**. Members will have until **April 16**, just prior to the monthly meeting, to submit their absentee ballots by email to **nvarc_board@n1nc.org**.

The second focus of the plan is that of the Election itself.

The Board intends to conduct the Election Special Meeting by Video Conference on April 16, at the usual monthly meeting time of 19:30.

Instructions for the Video Conference will be sent to members in an email prior to the 16th.

Any absentee ballot received prior to the Special Meeting can be changed/overridden if you attend the video conference, so feel free to email your ballot even if you do plan to attend online.

We intend to use the real-time polling feature available in our WebEx video conference to solicit any and all changed votes.

Please think about taking a leadership position in the club, or nominating someone you think would be a good (and willing!) leader.

NVARC Elections: Some History de Bruce, K1BG

The following article was written by NVARC cofounder Earl Russell, WR1Y, and appeared in the November 1992 issue of the Signal. I credit Earl with being the Father of NVARC. He organized the first meetings to organize a club, and served as its first president, and provided leadership that was critical in the early days of the club. I think of Russ as NVARC's George Washington.

The Nashoba Valley Amateur Radio Club officially begins its second year in January.

The momentum of the first six months has created a base-line for a vibrant, civic-oriented organization. We should be very proud of what has been accomplished at the same time striving to maintain the momentum.

Interesting activities and public service functions will be sufficient for survival, but survival is not enough.

The continued strength of the club will depend on its ability to attract new members. Each of us is an emissary of our club and should be proud enough of this affiliation to actively solicit new members. The Groton Septemberfest was a recruiting bonanza as evidenced by membership in our current ham class.

There must be continual activity in events like that if the club is to prosper.

Back in ~1963, I took the Novice test at a neighborhood ham's shack: one-on-one. I was 16, and nervous as heck about passing the 5wpm code test.

Apparently, I did well enough to pass, and became KN3FUV. I later upgraded to Tech, and was then K3FUV, which I let lapse in the 1970's, as other things in life were happening. Job, Army, Job, Grad School, Job, Job, Job.

In 2000, I decided to get back in, and passed the General, then, a year later, the Extra. Without code.

I've never been a true practitioner of the necessary physical & mental coordination needed for the CW arts, although I have a bunch of CW QSL cards from the 60's that witness at least a passing familiarity with it. I've also a certificate of membership in the ARRL Ragchewer's Club: issued to KN3FUV.

Lately, I've decided to try to increase my CW skills, and so, I take part in an informal NVARC CW net (daily at 0930; 3.562MHz, ~12-15wpm). I'm getting better, but still get all garfangled <a technical term> when I don't immediately recognize a character, and so miss the next few characters.

Also, there is a lot of QSB at 80meters for the short distance comms we are attempting, since most of the radiation is skyward, not groundwave. This makes it harder to copy when the signal fades out completely!

But it is good "real world" practice, IMHO.



Unfortunately, when operating on 80m, using the inverted Vee I wrote about in last month's Signal, I get a lot of RF in the house. So much that it knocks out my WiFi router. A single dit will do it. It does not happen on other antennas/bands.

The router recovers gracefully, but this is not a good situation.

I've inserted a choke Balun at the Vee's feed point: 14turns of RG58 on a type 31 core that Bob, W1XP, kindly lent me.

I measured/calculated that it provides almost 10K of reactance at 3.56MHz. That oughtta be enough.

But it doesn't get rid of the problem.

OK, so how about a 1:1 Balun? That's the next experiment.

Then I'll investigate the sub-optimal grounding system that I have thrown together.

Stay tuned. Don't touch that dial!

W1AW's schedule is at the same local time throughout the year. From the second Sunday in March to the first Sunday in November, UTC = Eastern US time + 4 hours. For the rest of the year, UTC = Eastern US time + 5 hours.

 Morse code transmissions: Frequencies are 1.8025, 3.5815, 7.0475, 14.0475, 18.0975, 21.0675, 28.0675, 50.350, and 147.555 MHz.

Slow Code = practice sent at 5, 7½, 10, 13, and 15 WPM. Fast Code = practice sent at 35, 30, 25, 20, 15, 13, and 10 WPM. Code bulletins are sent at 18 WPM.


